REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES for the Year Ended 30 SEPTEMBER 2018

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 30th September 2018. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 (as amended), and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The organisation's main objectives are outlined below:

- (a) to advance education by raising the level of understanding of nuclear weapons and other weapons of mass destruction amongst children, young people, disadvantaged groups and the general public.
- (b) to advance knowledge by the study and research of threats to international peace from nuclear weapons and other weapons of mass destruction.
- (c) to increase knowledge and public awareness of the effects of radioactivity and nuclear explosions on human health and well being.
- (d) to advance and increase knowledge of the environmental impact of nuclear weapons, nuclear accidents, nuclear waste and radiation.
- (e) to advance understanding of conflict resolution by providing information on non-violent approaches to resolving disputes between communities and nations.

Significant activities

In order to meet these objectives, some of the activities carried out by the charity during the year, include:

- Organising the Youth Peace Academy a 3-day training programme for 70 youth focussed on raising understanding of nuclear weapons and peace issues as well as build up skills in areas like: campaigning, press work, communications, film making, fundraising and much more;
- Production of education materials such as: lesson plans (Draft of Nuclear Weapons & Morality Unit, Draft of Environmental Implications of Nuclear Weapons), posters (Who's the Target), presentations and school talks (Survivors' Stories), training sessions (part of the Youth Peace Academy) and other handouts.
- Distribution of our resources (DVDs, units, posters and handouts) to schools, general public and other groups as well as other existing materials like books (Truth about Trident) and posters (Nuclear Morality Flowchart);
- Liaising with teachers, pupils and students to assist with nuclear weapons /pressure groups related assignments and research;
- Organising talks and presentations in schools across Scotland to advance knowledge of nuclear weapons issues (Survivors' Stories Programme);
- Organising film showings and other events to raise awareness of nuclear weapons (Nuclear Savage film showing & Atomic-Living in Dread & Promise/Benchmark 6);
- Attending congresses, annual conferences and other meetings to raise awareness of our resources and programmes (EIS Congress, Modern Studies Conference);
- Organising or attending meetings and discussions to advance knowledge of nuclear weapons amongst general public or elected representatives (Mayors for Peace & Nuclear Free Local Authorities Forum meeting, TEDx talk at Glasgow University)

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

The charity successfully completed the following events and activities during the year:

Survivors' Stories Programme

A series of videos, testimonies and resources have been put together to highlight the humanitarian and environmental impact of nuclear weapons. A training session for volunteer speakers has been offered and a series of school talks have been delivered. To date we have reached over 800 pupils studying Modern Studies, History and Religious Education in 9 schools (private and state) across Scotland (Secondary 1 - Secondary 6). Further publicity has been arranged to encourage

bookings for this programme;

Youth Peace Academy 2018

We were particularly successful in achieving our charitable objectives through our Youth Peace Academy. The event had over 70 participants, over 30 active volunteers and around 20 speakers and contributors including a first-generation survivor of Hiroshima bombing. The workshops and activities undertaken throughout the 3-day event have provided extensive information and time for analysis and critical thinking to all our participants. Evaluations forms after the event showed that majority of participants left the academy with a high level of understanding of nuclear weapons. Majority of participants have found the skills acquired in areas such as: communications, fundraising, media and film making extremely useful for future volunteering or employment work. These outcomes from the Academy would support the view that the academy has successfully achieved one of its major aims of informing participants about the impact of nuclear weapons as well as encouraging active citizenship amongst youth.

Film Showings

The film showings included: Nuclear Savage, The Man Who Saved the World, Atomic-Living in Dread & Promise and Benchmark 6. These have provided a platform for discussion and analysis of nuclear weapons and their impact

- with a total of approximately 200 participants;

Attending meetings and other events

Some of the presentations and meetings attended included:

- TEDx talk to Glasgow University reaching over 100 students to raise awareness of nuclear weapons and the Treaty on The Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons, adopted at the United Nations last year.
- Mayors for Peace & Nuclear Free Local Authorities Forum meeting reaching members of the public as well as over 7 elected representatives of various councils across Scotland. The presentation raised awareness of nuclear weapons, importance of peace education, International Day of Peace as well as the Treaty on the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons

Stalls

Stall were held at Scottish Trade Union Congress Youth Conference, EIS AGM & Modern Studies Conference

Outreach

A series of leafleting and canvasing took place around various colleges and universities across Scotland

Other ongoing activities

- Over 30 posters sent to schools directly;
- Approximately 500 Education DVD distributed to schools or general public;
- Approximately a dozen pupils assisted via email or phone on nuclear weapons related assignments;
- 4 students assisted with their higher degree projects on nuclear weapons (video & audio interviews given);
- 6 Truth about Trident Books given to school teachers on request;
- By now our units have been viewed on www.tes.com over 5,357 times and downloaded over 3,929 times;
- By now the education videos on our Vimeo account have been played over 1500 times;

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial position

The charity accounts show a deficit for the year of £27,295, which was planned expenditure in relation to grant funding recognised in the prior year results. £17,534 of funds are being carried forward to the next financial year.

There is no formal reserves policy at this time, but it is the aim of the charity to raise additional grant funding in line with the budgeted costs of future activities..

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation.

Charity constitution

The Charity is a Scottish Charitable Incorporated Organisation (a SCIO). It was registered in its current legal form on 21 September 2016. It has a single tier structure and as such the trustees are the members of the charity.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

Appointment of trustees is governed by the Constitution of the Charity.

The trustees are authorised to appoint new committee members to fill vacancies through resignation or death of an existing committee member.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS for the Year Ended 30 SEPTEMBER 2018

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Financial reporting standard 102 - reduced disclosure exemptions

The charity has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemption in preparing these financial statements, as permitted by FRS 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland':

the requirements of Section 7 Statement of Cash Flows.

Critical accounting judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of the Charity's accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates. Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to estimates are recognised prospectively.

There are no significant judgements or estimates used in the preparation of these accounts.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Donations

Donations are recognised on receipt. In the event that a donation is subject to conditions that require a level of performance before the charity is entitled to the funds, the income is deferred and not recognised until those conditions are fully met.

Grants

Grants are recognised when the charity has been notified in writing of both the amount and settlement date. Grants are deferred if terms or conditions must be met before the charity has entitlement to the resources.

Fundraising

Funds raised from fundraising events are recognised in the period in which the event was held.

Sale of Goods

Revenue is recognised when the significant risks and rewards of ownership have been transferred to the customer, recovery of the consideration is probable, the associated costs and possible return of goods can be estimated reliably, there is no continuing management involvement with the goods, and the amount of revenue can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Computer equipment

- 33% on cost

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Financial instruments

The charity has financial assets and financial liabilities of a kind that qualify as basic financial instruments.

Debtor

Short term debtors are measured at transaction price, less any impairment.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash balances.

Creditors

Short term trade creditors are measured at the transaction price. Other financial liabilities, including bank loans, are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

Provisions

Provisions are determined by discounting the expected future cash flows at a pre-tax rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the liability. The unwinding of the discount is recognised as finance cost.
