
The General Assembly

The General Assembly has representatives from every member state and they have one vote each. It is the main body for debates and discussions.

The Security Council

The Security Council is made up of 5 permanent representatives: China, France, Russia, UK and USA plus 10 other representatives elected for two-year terms. The decisions made by the Security Council is binding on all member states.
